

## Sport Funding for the Academic Year 2016-2017

### PE and Sport Premium Grant Expenditure 2016/17

At Whitwick Saint John the Baptist C.E. Primary School our aim is for all pupils to lead healthy and active lifestyles, develop health and emotional well-being and to develop a lifelong love of sport and physical exercise. We are keen to allocate the funding appropriately to achieve our goals.

#### P.E. Funding

##### Overview of the school

The P.E. and Sport Premium is government money designed to help develop the quality of physical education and sport in primary schools. Schools receive P.E and Sports Premium Funding based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to Year 6. In 2016/2017 (March to March) the funding allocated is £9,450 per school. Break down £8,000 plus £5 per child.

The scheme enables the children to accumulate points through participation in school sporting events, which they can then spend on activities at the local leisure centres, such as swimming and badminton. **Our Sporting Year**

Over the last year Whitwick Saint John the Baptist C E Primary School has been totally committed to increasing their children’s participation and competition in PE and extra-curricular sport. As part of their membership to the NWLSSP the school has competed in at least 28 partnership competitions, entering 55 teams, with 168 girls and 263 boys taking part in at least 20 different sports. We are particularly proud of the increased participation from girls this year and this has been evident through the entry of multiple girl’s teams into a variety of sports, including three teams in table tennis and two football teams.

This year the school has gained the Gold Sports Mark award for the very first time which demonstrates the high quality of provision the school provides. The school has been a venue for CPD this year for teachers within the partnership. The school has also organized multiple sporting events for other schools as part of its membership of the Coalville Collaborative group and participated in many of the sports this group offers. This has included organising a Year 2 Mini-Red tennis competition with local schools to provide opportunities for Key Stage 1 competition and participation.

We have been very competitive in many Level 2 competitions making it to the semi-final stage of our section in many sports including Year 5/6 Girls Cricket, Year 5/6 Tag Rugby, Year 5/6 Dodgeball, Year 5/6 Girls Football and Year 5/6 Hockey to name but a few.

At Whitwick we are particularly proud of the fact we have been able to reach the further stages of tournaments against schools which have more children on roll in Key Stage Two.

We continue to achieve this success with many children who are not members of external clubs and a large percentage of this success is down to the commitment and passion of staff.

The school has worked hard to establish external links, this year alone the school has collaborated with coaches from Coalville Rugby club, Broom Leys Cricket Club and Whitwick Junior Badminton Club supporting lessons, CPD and extra-curricular clubs. We have been delighted that this year more of our children have joined external clubs following their opportunities and success within school. We believe this continued partnership will develop and create positive outcomes for the clubs, the school and the children. In July 2017 we retained the Sainsbury's School Games Gold Mark and in October 2017 we were shortlisted for 'Primary School of the Year' as part of the North West Leicestershire Local Sports Alliance Awards.
