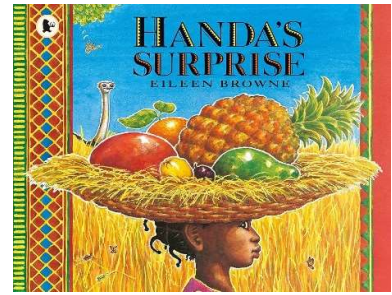
We also celebrated our very first Preschool Christmas Party! It was truly heart-warming to hear our children singing proudly with their families, and the dancing was nothing short of incredible.

EYFS



The children in EYFS have had a wonderful start to their journey at big school! They are already showing great independence, settling into new routines, and feeling very grown up as part of our school community.

Our story focus this term has been *Handa's Surprise*. The children have loved exploring the story, writing their own lists of fruits using their initial sounds, and retelling the story in their own words. They have also been very creative, weaving beautiful baskets for Handa to carry to Akeyo, decorating fruit to place inside them, and even using real fruit to print with paint.

We are so proud of how quickly the children have embraced phonics. They have made an amazing start and are feeling very grown up with their very first reading folders. Already, their enthusiasm and progress in reading has been fantastic!

It has been a joy getting to know each and every child, and we can't wait to learn more about them as we continue our exciting journey together.

Year 1

Year 1 have had a very successful and enjoyable half term. The children have worked hard and shown a positive attitude to their learning.

In **Geography**, the children learnt about **hot and cold places**, identifying the **equator** and discussing which countries have hot or cold climates. They explored the **physical features of hot deserts**, and after half term will learn about the people who live in hot and cold deserts and how they adapt to survive.

In **English**, the children studied the story **Lost and Found**. They enjoyed creating **freeze frames** to explore key moments and wrote **setting descriptions of Antarctica**.

In **Maths**, the focus has been on **partitioning numbers to 20**, identifying how many **tens and ones** make each number.

We have also enjoyed festive activities, including **hot chocolate outdoors**, learning about **being a good friend**, **Christmas crafts**, and singing for **Carols for Cancer**.

The children are working very well together and are showing increasing **determination and perseverance** in their learning. Thank you to parents and carers for supporting children with their **pink practice books**. New work and reading book changes will begin in the New Year.



Year 2



Year 2 Shine in a Truly Moving Nativity Performance

We were also incredibly impressed by their confident speaking. Every line was delivered with such pride, helping to tell the story with warmth and meaning. The children’s lovely dance moves added an extra sparkle to the performance, bringing smiles all around.

Year 3

Year 3 News: From Castles to Quakes!

Year 3 have had an exciting and action-packed start to the term, diving into history, geography, science and even a new language!

Following our fantastic trip to Tamworth Castle, the children were inspired to explore the events leading up to the Battle of Hastings and the fierce battle for the throne. They have shown great curiosity, asking thoughtful questions and making connections between what they saw at the castle and what they are learning in class.

We have now launched our new topic, Angry Planet Earth, where the children are discovering how dynamic our planet can be. They have been learning all about earthquakes, including *why* they happen and *where* they are most likely to occur. As part of our immersion into the topic, Year 3 took part in an earthquake safety role-play, practising the important steps of Drop, Cover, and Hold. They also created colourful and informative safety posters to share their knowledge. They have now begun exploring tectonic plates and the powerful Ring of Fire, developing a strong understanding of the forces shaping our world.

In Science, our focus has turned to Light and Dark. The children have been investigating different sources of light and carrying out hands-on tests to find out which materials are the most reflective. Their predictions and teamwork skills have been wonderful to see.

Year 3 have also taken their first steps into learning French. They have enjoyed practising numbers to ten, colours, greetings, and the four seasons.

Year 4



What a wonderfully busy and memorable half term it has been for Year 4!

The children have shown fantastic enthusiasm, curiosity, and resilience across all areas of the curriculum, and we are incredibly proud of everything they have achieved.

Throughout the half term, Year 4 have consistently shown *Penguin Power* by working hard, supporting one another and striving to do their best—even when learning felt challenging. They have lived out our Christian values through acts of kindness, respect, responsibility, and compassion, both in and out of the classroom.

One of the highlights of the half term was our informative and interactive visit to **Bosworth Battlefield**. The children immersed themselves in history, deepening their understanding of the Battle of Bosworth through engaging activities, expert-led talks, and hands-on exploration of the site. They asked thoughtful questions, made excellent links to our classroom learning and demonstrated exemplary behaviour throughout the day. The trip truly brought our History learning to life and sparked many lively discussions back in class.

In Design and Technology, pupils have been busy designing and creating **pneumatically operated toys**. They explored how air pressure can be used to create movement and carefully applied this knowledge to build imaginative and functional designs. The children showed perseverance when refining their ideas and took great pride in their finished products. Their creativity and determination were wonderful to see.

Finally, we were incredibly proud of the children when they hosted a **memorable Christingle service at church**. The pupils spoke clearly and confidently, sang beautifully and demonstrated deep understanding and respect throughout the service. It was a truly special occasion that reflected the children's spiritual growth and their ability to contribute meaningfully to our wider school community and it was a joy to share it with all who attended.

Year 5



This half term, Year 5 have completed their World War 2 history topic, with the highlight being their fantastic visit to Beaumanor Hall. As evacuees for the day, the children experienced codebreaking, explored an air-raid shelter and learned about rationing and life during the war.

In English, they have developed their writing skills through a range of different text types, while in Maths they have focused heavily on fractions. We have now immersed ourselves in Topic 3: Greece, where the children enjoyed tasting Greek foods and exploring the human and physical geography of the country.



Across the wider curriculum, the children have learned about forces and materials in Science, continued to strengthen their Art skills and deepened their understanding of online safety and building respectful relationships. They have also taken part in a variety of extra-curricular activities and have shown great confidence, independence and resilience throughout the term.

Year 6 – A magical term to remember!

In History, we ventured into the world of The Ancient Maya, uncovering their beliefs, number system and daily life. The topic sparked lots of curiosity and the classes enjoyed diving into the mysteries and stories of this ancient civilisation. Our English work also linked closely with this theme as we explored the legend 'Quetzalcoatl Brings Chocolate to Earth'. This led to imaginative narrative writing, with the children developing creative descriptions and story structures inspired by the tale.

In Maths, the focus has been on fractions, giving the children the chance to build on their knowledge of methods, spot patterns and apply their understanding in different contexts. The topic has offered plenty of opportunities for discussion, helping them to deepen their confidence with trickier concepts.

As we moved into the festive season, Christmas activities brought lots of excitement and variety to our days. We enjoyed a wonderful trip to the pantomime to see Cinderella and in true panto fashion, when asked if we had a good time, the answer was..."Oh yes we did!" We also took part in our cherished Christingle Service, filling the church with candlelight and reflections on the meaning of Christmas. To round off the celebrations, our Carols for Cancer performance brought beautiful music, festive warmth and a lovely sense of community to the end of term.

Our current school uniform is as follows:

- **Navy cardigan or jumper** with the **school logo**
- **Black or grey trousers** (not tracksuit bottoms) or a **skirt/ / pinafore dress/shorts**
- **White or blue polo shirt** (no logo required)
- **Black shoes or trainers** with **minimal logos**

Pupils are welcome to wear **blue and white chequered summer dresses or jumpsuits**, in keeping with our school colours.

Please ensure that **all uniform items are clearly named**, so that any lost items can be quickly returned.

Wearing the correct uniform helps promote a **sense of belonging** and ensures that all our pupils feel part of the school community. Thank you for helping us maintain these high standards.

Safeguarding

Protection Children is everyone's business!!

At Whitwick St John the Baptist CE Primary School, we understand the utmost importance of having robust systems for protecting children and safeguarding their welfare. All our staff and volunteers are vigilant and alert to any potential concerns about our pupils. We have a comprehensive safeguarding and child protection policy, which is available upon request from the school office.

If you have any concerns, please speak to the head teacher. We will treat your concern seriously and with the utmost care.

Parking



Please remember to park only in legal parking spots and to respect and adhere to all posted no-parking zones. Your cooperation in maintaining a safe environment around our school is greatly appreciated. Let us work together to ensure the safety of all our students and families.

We would kindly like to remind everyone to drive and park safely and considerately when dropping off or picking up children from school. Unfortunately, we have seen and heard reports of some dangerous and inconsiderate parking and manoeuvres.

The safety of our children is always our top priority, so please ensure you are parking appropriately and driving with care around the school.

How Can You Help?

- Park further away and walk to school
- Keep your speed down
- Park in a safe place following the Highway Code.
- Do not park on pavements
- Turn your engine off as soon as you have parked
- Keep the school gates clear at all times - stopping here, even to drop off your child for a short period of time, is dangerous
- Do not enter the school car park unless authorised to do so
- Do not block local residents' drives
- Leave the middle of the road free, with enough room for other road users to easily pass through
- Leave enough room for emergency vehicles to easily pass through
- Make sure your child leaves and enters your vehicle safely to and from the pavement
- Check for pedestrians and cyclists before opening a car door
- Take care when reversing
- Remember - it only takes one vehicle to be parked inconsiderately for there to be an impact on accessibility to emergency services or others. Do not be that one.

Registering will enable the school to access funding for your child every year while they remain in primary school. They are not obliged to have a hot meal every day. This funding will help provide valuable support for your child.
